


Mrs. Edwards's Classroom

Rules and Expectations



My expectations for your child's educational success include appropriate behavior, being responsible, completing assigned activities, staying on task, using good manners, showing respect for others, and always striving to do their best! We are looking for good Bethlehem Star Citizen Behavior.

We have 3 school wide PBIS rules.

- 1. Respect Yourself**
- 2. Respect Others**
- 3. Respect Property**

During the first weeks of school we will be discussing these rules and what they mean. Students will practice showing respect and what it looks like with all three- yourself, others, and property.

We will also have 5 classroom reminders that we will work together to come up with. They might include always doing our best, keeping hands, feet, and objects to ourselves, following directions the first time given, etc.

How can you help at home? Have brief discussions about the rules to ensure your child is making good choices. Ask them, "How can you show kindness? How will your teachers know you are a good listener?"

- Stickers

- Positive phone calls or notes to parents
- Treasure box

Consequences

- Verbal reminders
- Discussions of rules
- Modeling and practicing behaviors
- Time-out away from activity
- Notify a parent if same misbehavior is repeated frequently
